NGĀ TURE I TE WHARE PAREMATA - PARLIAMENT RULES

Photo ID for access into Parliament

Note: Photo ID will be required from people 18 and over (passport, driver's license, fire-arms license, student ID, Kiwi Access Card)

Identification requirements for registration desk, either:

1. **Photo identification** (as above); **or**
2. **Birth certificate and something with same name** - needs to match birth certificate. (e.g., Credit card, debit card, power, telephone bill, bank statement); **or**
3. **Two documents with the same name and address** from different companies (e.g., Power or telephone bill, bank statement, rates notice etc)

Taonga

Approval is required in advance for taonga that are **traditional weapons** to be taken into Parliament, these can be brought to the mihi whakatau but are **not permitted in the gallery**, tokotoko are permitted as long as they are the size of/used as actual walking sticks. **Whānau Photos** can be carried into the gallery for the reading.

Whakaahua | Taking Photos (Cameras & mobile phones)

Taking photos inside parliament **is not permitted**.

ME NOHO TAKATŪ - BE PREPARED

- Dress Code: Black
- Bedding: If you are staying at Pipitea Marae please bring a blanket or sleeping bag.
- Weather: Ensure you pack warm for the cold weather - hats, scarves, jackets.
- Medication: Don't forget any medication you require.
- Pack some snacks and wai māori for the trip.

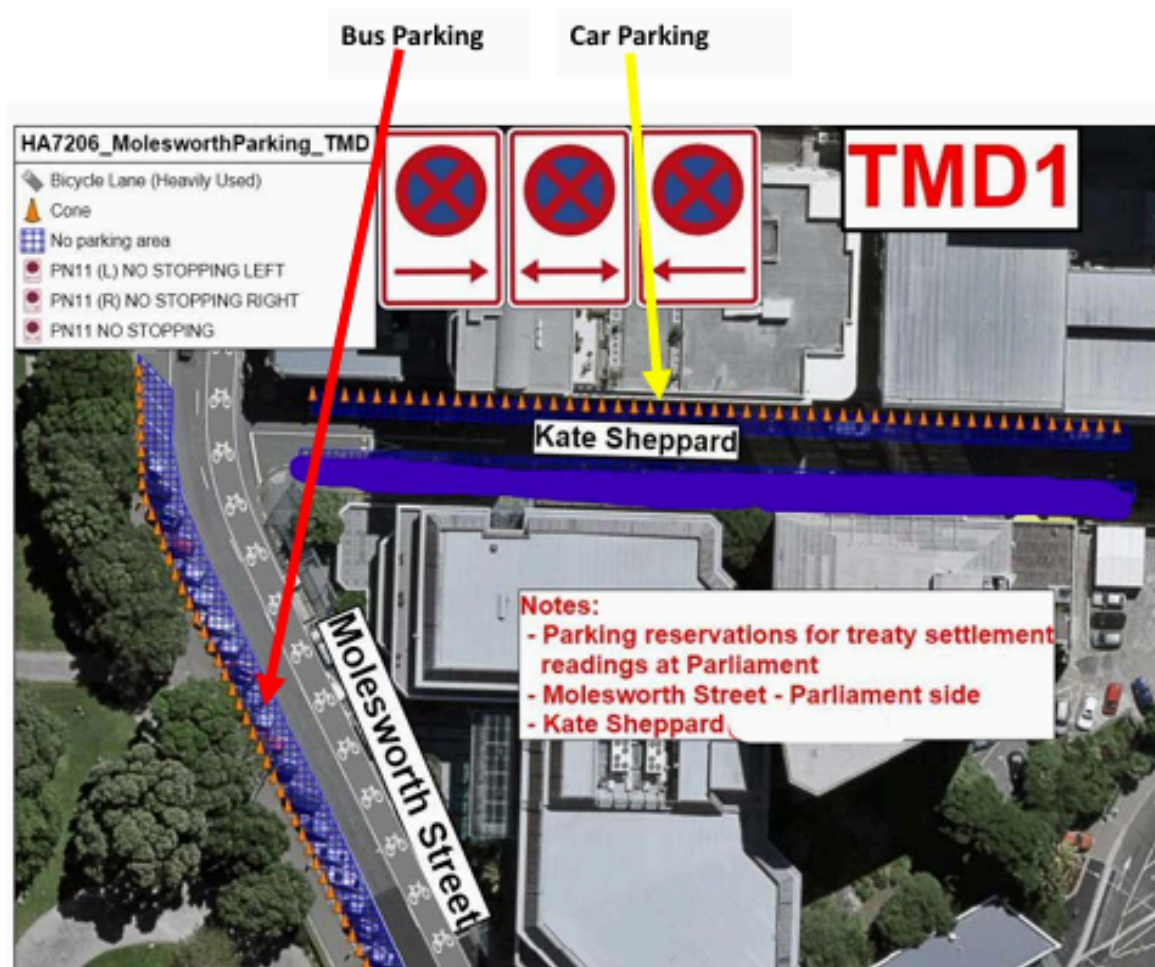
